# Bulgaria

- Bulgaria is a country in the Southeast Europe.

- The name of *Bulgaria* is derived from the Bulgars, a tribe of Turkic origin that founded the country!



# Flag of Bulgaria

# Traditional dish of Bulgaria

- Banitsa
- This tasty dish is a traditional Bulgarian pastry made by layering a combination of beaten eggs and bits of cheese amongst filo pastry. It is then baked in the oven until it is cooked on the inside and crispy on the outside.





# Nestinarstvo

- Nestinarstvo, or the ritual fire dancing on live coals, is an ancient Bulgarian custom, which has both Christian and pagan elements. It is believed to originate from the Thracians, and more accurately from their sun worship. Only fire dancers (nestinari) can dance over the coals – people, dedicated to the mystery of the ritual. Dancers can be both men and women.



# Languages og Bulgaria

- Official language is Bulgarian! 85% of people speak Bulgarian!
- Other language are:
  - Turkish(9.1%)
  - Romani(4.2%)



# Nature of Bulgaria

- Belogradchik rocks, located in the western foothills of the Balkan mountain. The vastness of these rock sculptures spread more than 30km in length and 5km in width.





# Nature of Bulgaria

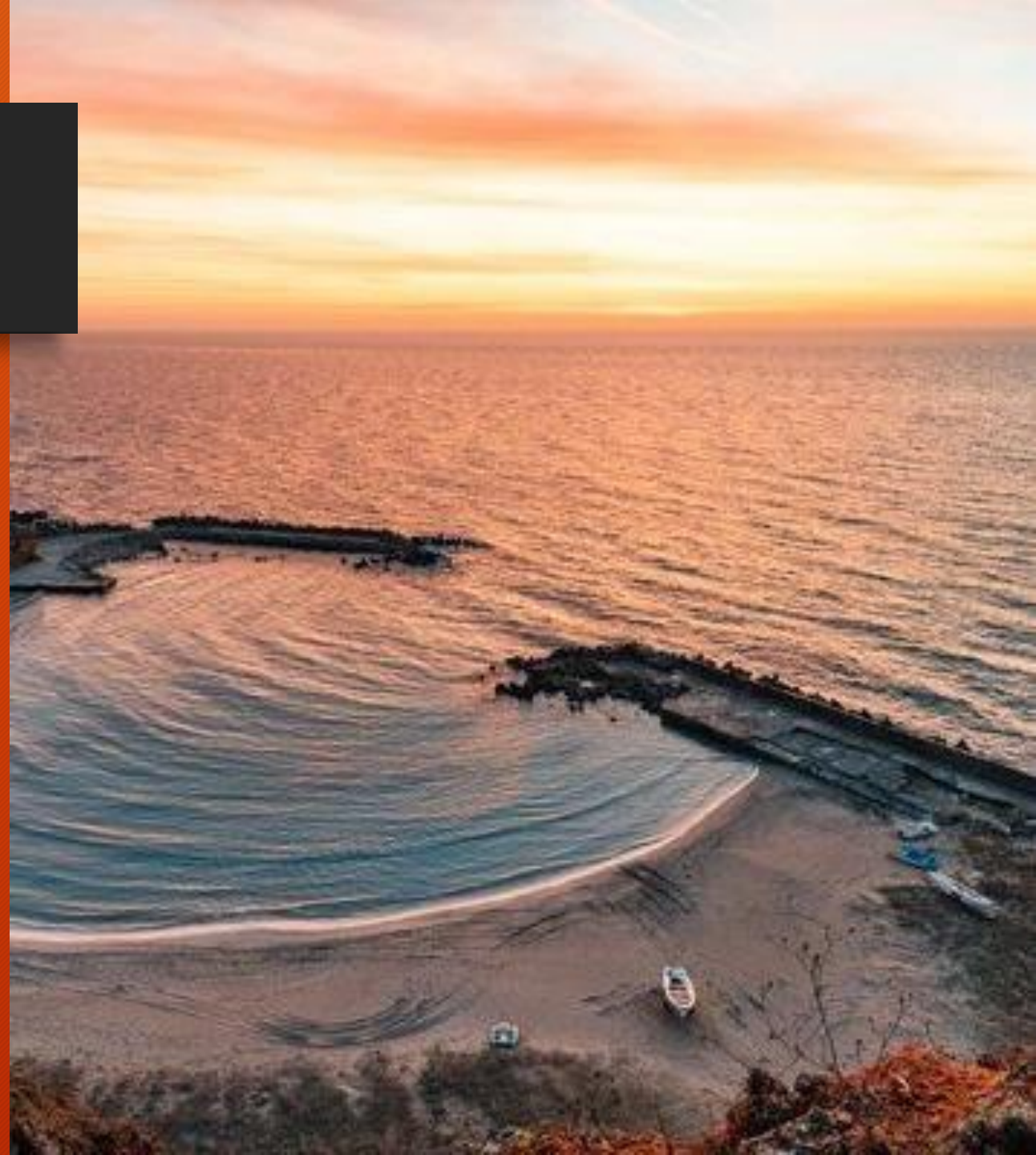
- Prohodna Eyes of the god cave!
- **Prohodna** – one of the most famous and the most easily accessible caves in Bulgaria,
- No wonder the locals call them “God’s eyes,” and sometimes the “devil eyes”. If you look at them from a certain angle, imagination will create a person’s face, looking down, and in rainy weather they are beginning to trickle “tears”.





# Bulgaria sea

- Bulgaria's Black Sea resorts have been popular holiday locations for more than a century, though it wasn't until the 1960s that the coastline was developed for mass tourism, with Communist party officials from across the former Eastern Bloc descending on the beaches each year for a spot of socialist fun in the sun
