LAVOSLAV LEOPOLD RUŽIČKA


13th September, 1887, Vukovar. He died on September 26, 1976 in Mammerna in Switzerland and he was buried in Zurich.

He lived with his parents and younger brother Stephen.

He finished elementary school in Osijek and classical grammar school

He studied in Karlsruhe, Germany chemistry at the Technical High School

He earned the title of Dr. Under Supervision Professor Staudinger



1939-Nobel Prize in Chemistry for work on Polymental and higher terpenes.

VLADIMIR PRELOG

Croatian and Swiss chemist

Sarajevo, July 23, 1906 - Zurich, January 7, 1998

A new solution for an analytical instrument in chemistry laboratory

Publishes a number of papers in the field of organic synthetic chemistry

Develops the synthesis of sulfonamibiotics and chemotherapeutics




1975 Nobel Prize in chemistry for his research into the stereochemistry of organic molecules and reactions

IVO ANDRIĆ

He was the one of the most popular writers

10th of October, 1892, Travnik

He finished elementary school in Višegrad, high school in Sarajevo, studied philosophy in Zagreb, Vienna, Krakow and Graz, where he received his doctorate in 1892



In 1961, he received the Nobel Prize for Literature.
